



## CASE MANAGEMENT AGENCY (CMA) TRANSITION UPDATE

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Please note that Colorado Cross-Disability Coalition (CCDC) recreated this memo from a memo created by Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) on this subject matter.

### **PURPOSE:**

There are changes to the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS). These changes refer to changes in Case Management Agencies (CMAs) for All Long-Term Services and Supports (LTSS), Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities for All interested Stakeholders.

In Colorado, we now have 20 CMAs servicing specific designated service areas. We outlined these 20 CMAs and Designated Service Areas below.

The State condensed the CMAs in Colorado to 20 for the State Agency, Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) who manages Medicaid, to have better oversight of these Agencies. As part of this process, there is a transition period to provide us with effective services without a break in these services.

Colorado Cross-Disability Coalition (CCDC) provides below which Designated Service Area is in which phase. There are three transition phases.

### **BACKGROUND:**

In December 2022, HCPF invited all Colorado CMAs to competitively bid to become the CMA in a designated service area. Prior to 2022, HCPF held several stakeholder engagement meetings to identify these Designated Service Areas (Area). Each Area across the State of Colorado, identified below, will have one Case Management Agency (CMA). These CMAs will provide current and potential members with Long-Term Services and Supports (LTSS), screening, eligibility assessment, needs assessment, and referral to access LTSS programs. These CMAs will also provide ongoing case management services and LTSS to members within their defined service areas.

HCPF issued a Notices of Intent to Award for solicitation, CMA Activities and State General Fund Program Services on June 12, 2023, for 18 of the 20 Defined Service Areas. The remaining two Defined Services Areas received their Notices on July 21, 2023.

HCPF is working with both incoming and outgoing agencies to determine individual agency transition timelines. HCPF will also provide communications timely to members impacted by these changes. These Transition Phase timelines may change as the transitions proceed. CMA Transition Phases are listed by Defined Service Areas along with the CMAs HCPF intends to award contracts to pending any protest outcomes.
